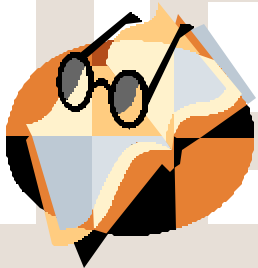


General information about the GED

GED Candidates must first attend the Adult Education Center in Murray to complete the DAEL-6 form (application to take GED) before they will be allowed to take the GED test.

The DAEL-6 form must be signed by the adult education teacher/staff member who has properly checked the student's eligibility. You must be a minimum age of 17 and out of school one full year or your high school class must have graduated and you have obtained your superintendent's permission. Those who are 19 or over usually fit the "class has graduated" criteria.

GED testing procedure

In order to take the GED, you must first score an average of 45 on the GED Practice Test and have a completed DAEL-6 Form. You complete this step at the Calloway County Adult Education Center.

Then, call the MSU GED Counseling and Testing Center at 762-6851 to schedule your examination. The cost of the GED test is \$30.00. To retake any part (and many people do), the cost is \$6.00 per part.

GED Candidates must have some form of picture ID to take the GED (A driver's license with a picture will do) and their signed DAEL-6 form.



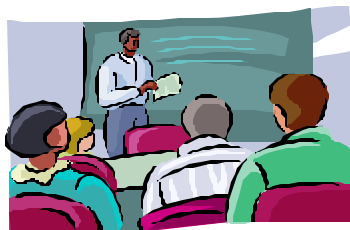

WHAT IS THE GED TEST?

The GED Test is five tests in the areas of Writing Skills, Social Studies, Science, Literature and the Arts, and Mathematics. The questions in each of these tests require a client to use general knowledge and thinking skills. Few questions ask about facts, details, or definitions.

Even though a client may not have finished high school, they probably have gained knowledge and skills through experience, reading, and informal training. The GED Tests are designed to measure the important knowledge and skills, usually learned during four years of high school, that a client may have obtained in a different manner.

With the exception of Part II of the Writing Skills Test, which requires the client to write an essay, all questions on the GED Test are multiple choice with five possible answers given. The questions range in difficulty from easy to hard, and cover a wide range of subjects.
